



F.I.D.E. Congress 1954:

(8k) Tournament for the World's Junior Championship in 1955

Of the invitations presented in 1953 for the organization of this tournament, that of the Argentine Federation was withdrawn. After discussing the two remaining invitations as well as a new one presented in 1954 by the Canadian Federation the Congress decided that the tournament in 1955 would be organized by the French Federation if that Federation were able to confirm its invitation definitely before 15th November, 1954; if not, the tournament would be organized by the Belgian Federation. The Canadian Federation will have an absolute priority for the organization of the tournament in 1957; it will, however, be free to defer until the Congress of 1955 its definite announcement as to whether or not it will make use of this priority.


The United States Chess Federation should like to send two representatives to play in the World Junior Chess Championship Tournament which is to be held in Belgium starting July 21, 1955.


Congress of F.I.D.E. Gothenburg 1955 August 13th.:

A proposal from the Belgian Chess Federation to appoint Baelen as FIDE Youth Leader was not adopted.

Spassky kept in touch with his Chess Grandfather.

Baelen was a co-founder of a chess circle in his town Schilde: the Boris Spassky Chess Club.

Participated in the organization of the first of the club's famous 14 international youth tournaments (1965-1982), with winners as LJUBOJEVIC, ROMANICHIN, STEAN, CHRISTIANSEN, SPEELMAN, AZMAIPARASHVILI, EHLVEST, WELLS.
