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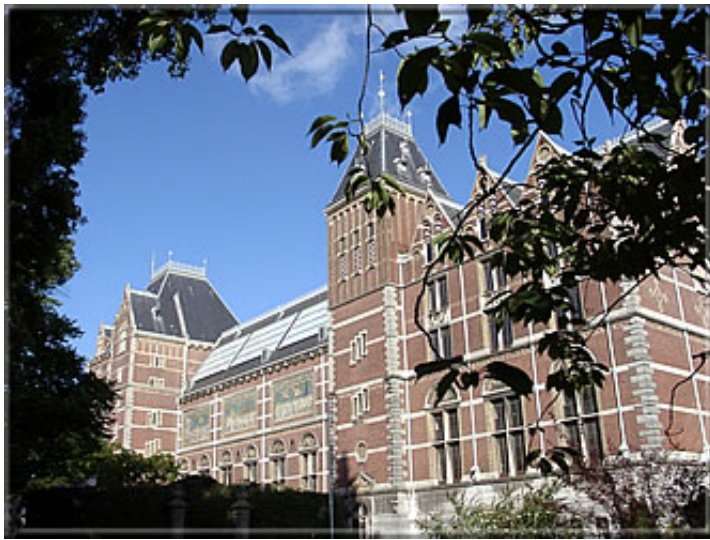
## **In expectation of the General Meeting in Amsterdam: From the club seat to the Max Euwe-Centrum in pictures**
