
Lecture by J. Eidinow: Reading between Squares - The Role of Chess in Literature (Düsseldorf, 2005-03-10)

Three KWA members attended an interesting lecture held by John Eidinow on March 10th, 2005 at 7 p.m. in the Goethe Museum, Schloß Jägerhof in Düsseldorf.



The Briton is co-author - together with David Edmonds - of the book "Bobby Fischer Goes to War" published in 2004 by HarperCollins Publishers, now brought out in a German edition by DVA under the title "Wie Bobby Fischer den Kalten Krieg gewann".

Eidinow was with the BBC and for the 7th time he held a lecture at the Deutsch-Britische Gesellschaft (German-British Society).



Besides the genesis of the book about the match of the century in Reykjavik 1972 he gave a review on geniuses with bad manners (Ludwig Wittgenstein and Robert J. Fischer) and on chess in literature.
