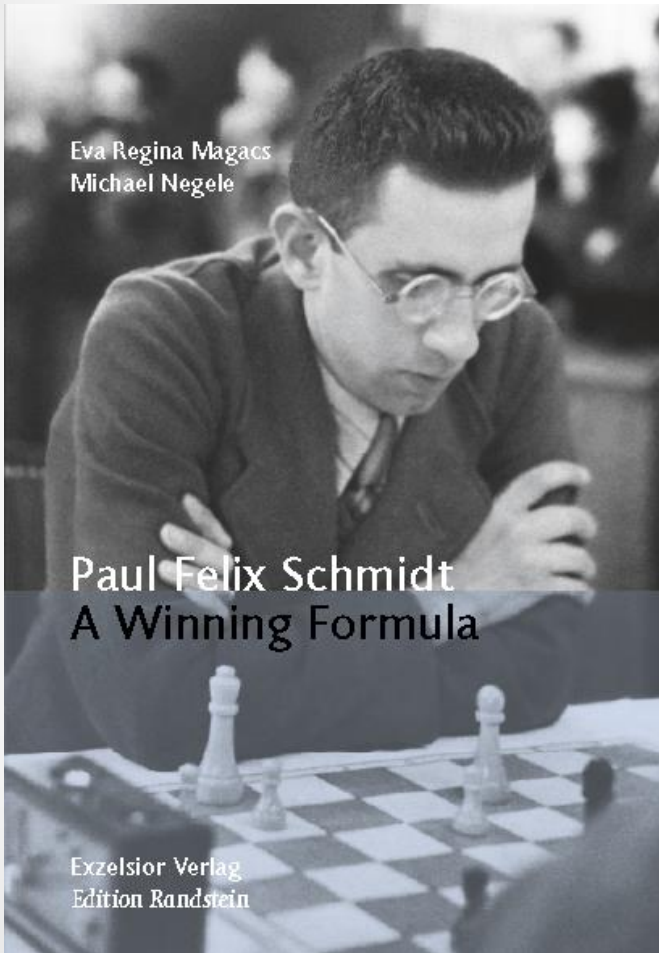

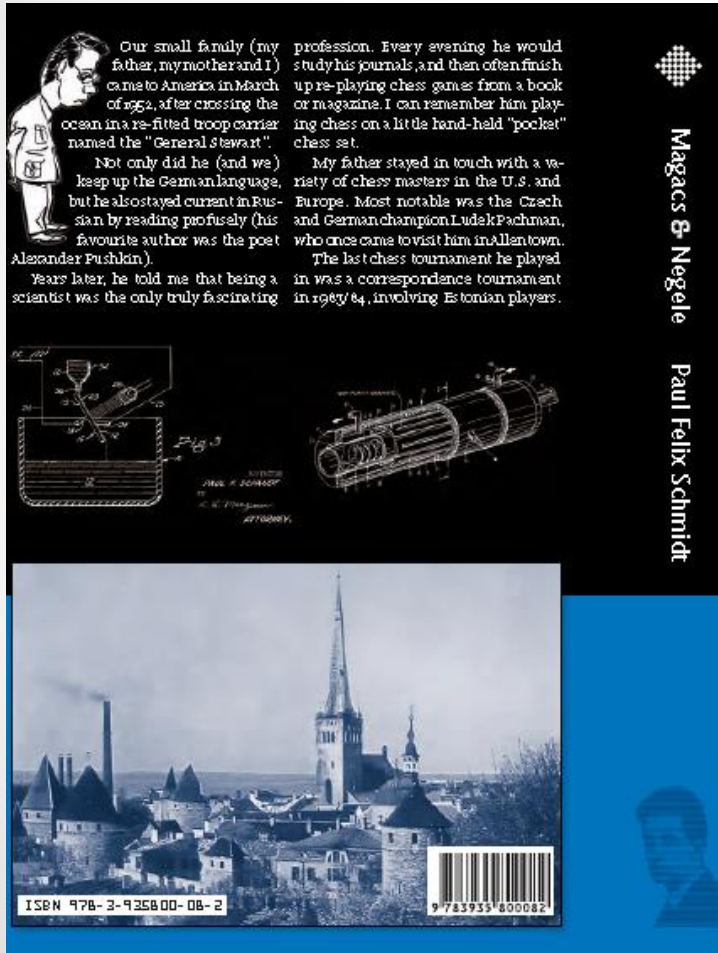

Since 2000 he has contributed more than 70 articles with a historical chess background to the German chess magazines *Kiessler*, *KARL* and *SCHACH*. In 2005 he was a founder of the Ken

Wipplid Association for the bibliography and history of chess. Michael was one of the editors of the monograph *Emmanuel Lasker - Denker Wehenbürgerschachweltmeister* (Exzelsior, 2009) and he contributed to *Schauspiel des Geistes* (Exzelsior, 2012) with an historical review of blindfold chess.

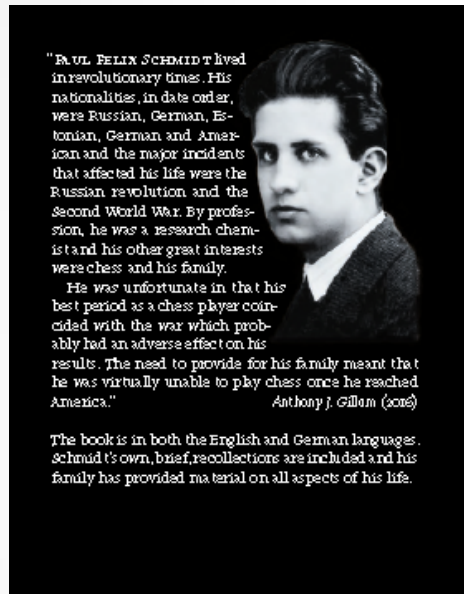
