Works as financial officer at Fire Safety Design AB in Malmö.

ICCF: Swedish ICCF delegate 1981-1995. Chairman of the ICCF Documentation Committee until 1995. Got the Bertl von Massow medal in gold. One IM norm. Stopped playing cc in 1995. Passive rating 2315.

SSKK. The Correspondence Chess Committee of the Sweden Chess Federation. Member of the SSKK board 1975-1995. Got the award for the best correspondence chess game in Sweden 1976. Editor of SSKK-bulletinen 1978-1984. Initiator of the Axelson Memorial - the strongest cc tournament so far with 15 GMs, of them five world champions.

Sweden Chess Federation: Got the Collijn medal in gold 1986. Federation arbiter.

Lunds Akademiska Schackklubb (LASK): President in three periods, last one 1995-2002. Webmaster 2000-2002. Got the Chess Award for the best Swedish Club-site in 2002. Honorary president 2003.

Chess Café Holiday Quiz 1997-2003: Twice winner (1997 & 2002) and twice runner-up (1999 & 2000) in this non-official Chess History World Cup.

Book projects:

The Games of GM Gideon Ståhlberg. After about ten years' work 1924 games has been indentified. With help from dozens of chess friends all over the world the complete scores of 1385 games (839 with annotations) and 29 fragments have been found. 510 games still missing.

The Games of GM Gösta Stoltz. After about ten years' work 1542 games has been indentified. With help from dozens of chess friends all over the world the complete scores of 789 games (586 with annotations) and 21 fragments have been found. 732 games still missing.

The Complete Games of the Stockholm Olympiad 1937. Start in 2004. The original game scores have been found. In this project I work together with Peter Holmgren.

Chess Library:

About 3000 items containing mainly general works, correspondence chess, tournament books, biographies and magazines. Besides a collection of classical chess philately, prints, postcards, photos, manuscripts, correspondence and autographs.
