In this chapter I have included not only periodicals with a regular chess column, but also magazines / newspapers where were mentioned any connections with chess, and mainly for the older publications.

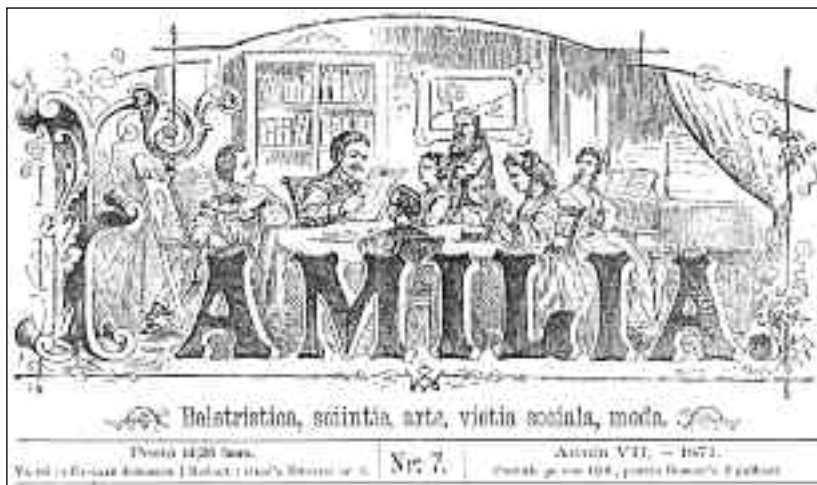
After WW II many magazines and newspapers began to include a chess column or chess news. For these, I did not intend to present here more details than a simple mention.

The magazine also presented various puzzles:

Problema cavalului about săritura calului (= *Knight's jump*), in 1866;

Gîcitură de siacu (= *Chess puzzle*), a letter-game where is used săritura calului (= *Knight's jump*), with the solution: Hai să dăm mîină cu mîină // Cei cu inima română.
