For you to be alone is not a thankless dull inert life (as those with a herd mentality) or those that nervously move in a circle (like the neurasthenic¹), instead much more simple, you enjoy healthy, always productive inspirational thoughts. And further, the ones with the herd mentality do not bother or irritate you; they do not create a dislike for you since you can understand somehow to maneuver the world and illuminate their seemingly egotistical and elevated cosmical mind.

Around you everything blooms. I have the feeling as if you amble through a flowering garden (flowers = rows of thoughts whose aroma you breathe in and enjoy).
